

# Tutorial: Submitting a file to Turnitin.com through Canvas

This tutorial demonstrates how to submit a file to a Turnitin.com assignment in Canvas.

1. Locate and click on the assignment you wish to submit.

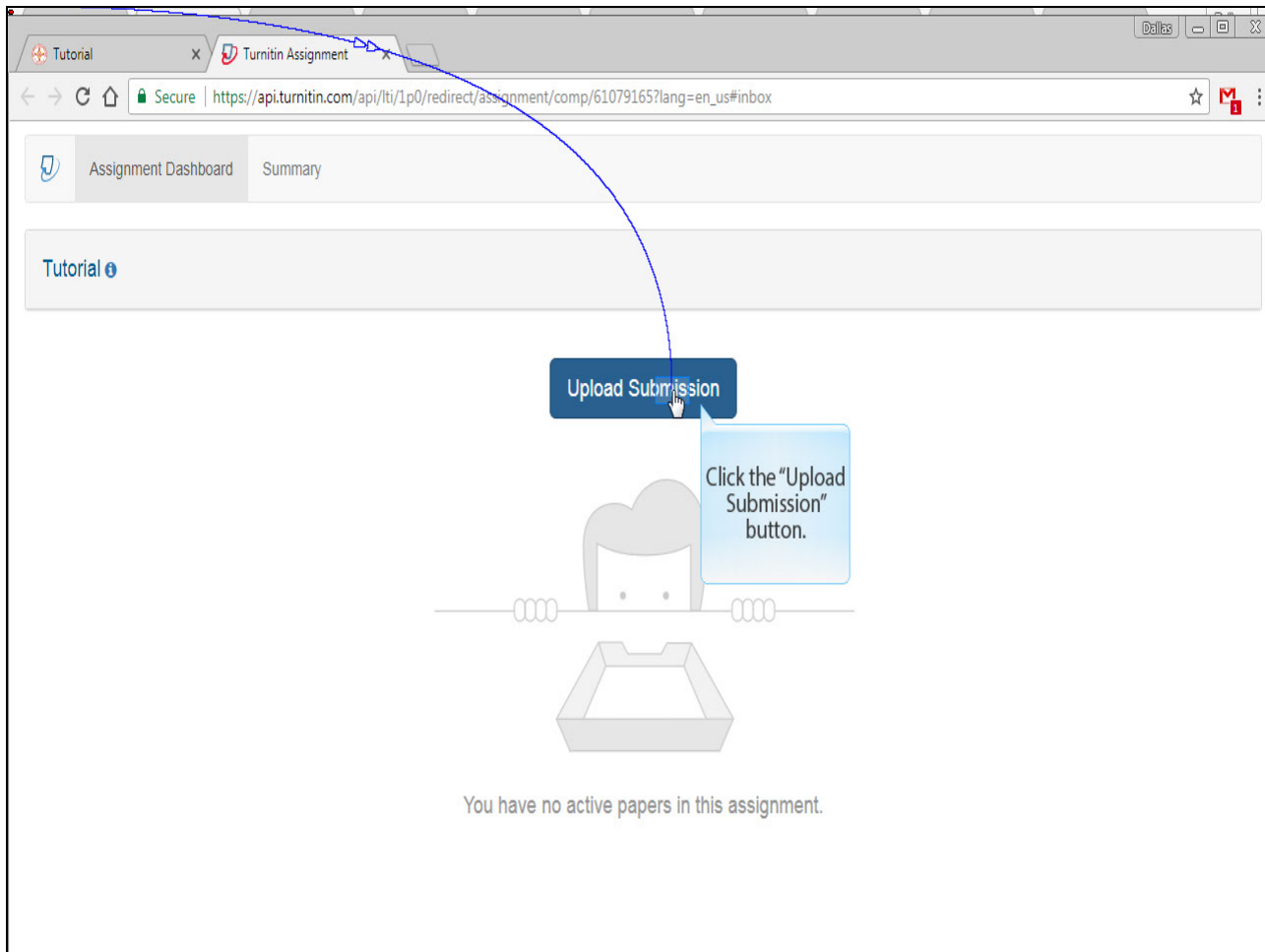

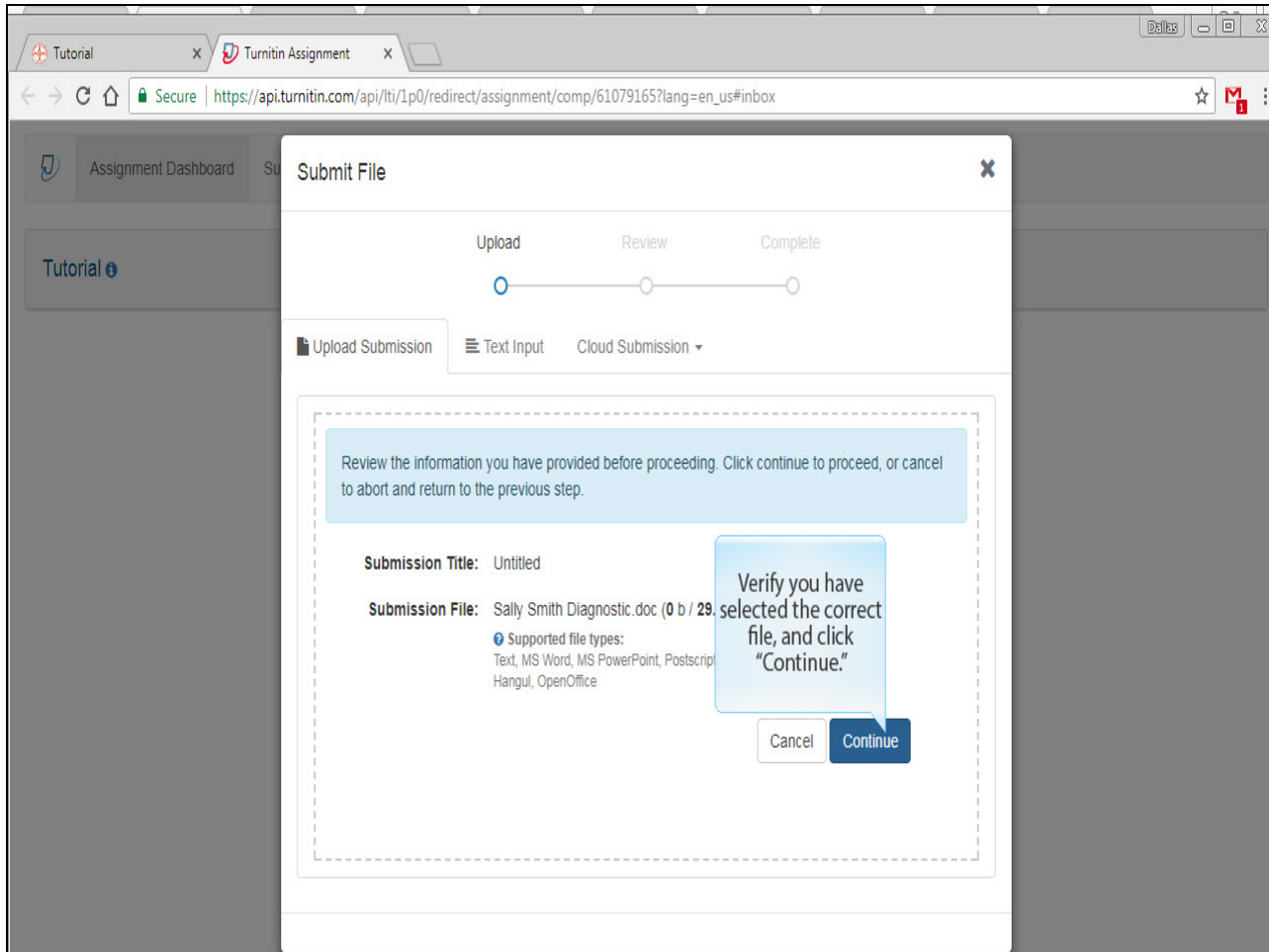
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**3. When the new window has opened, click the “Upload Submission” button.**



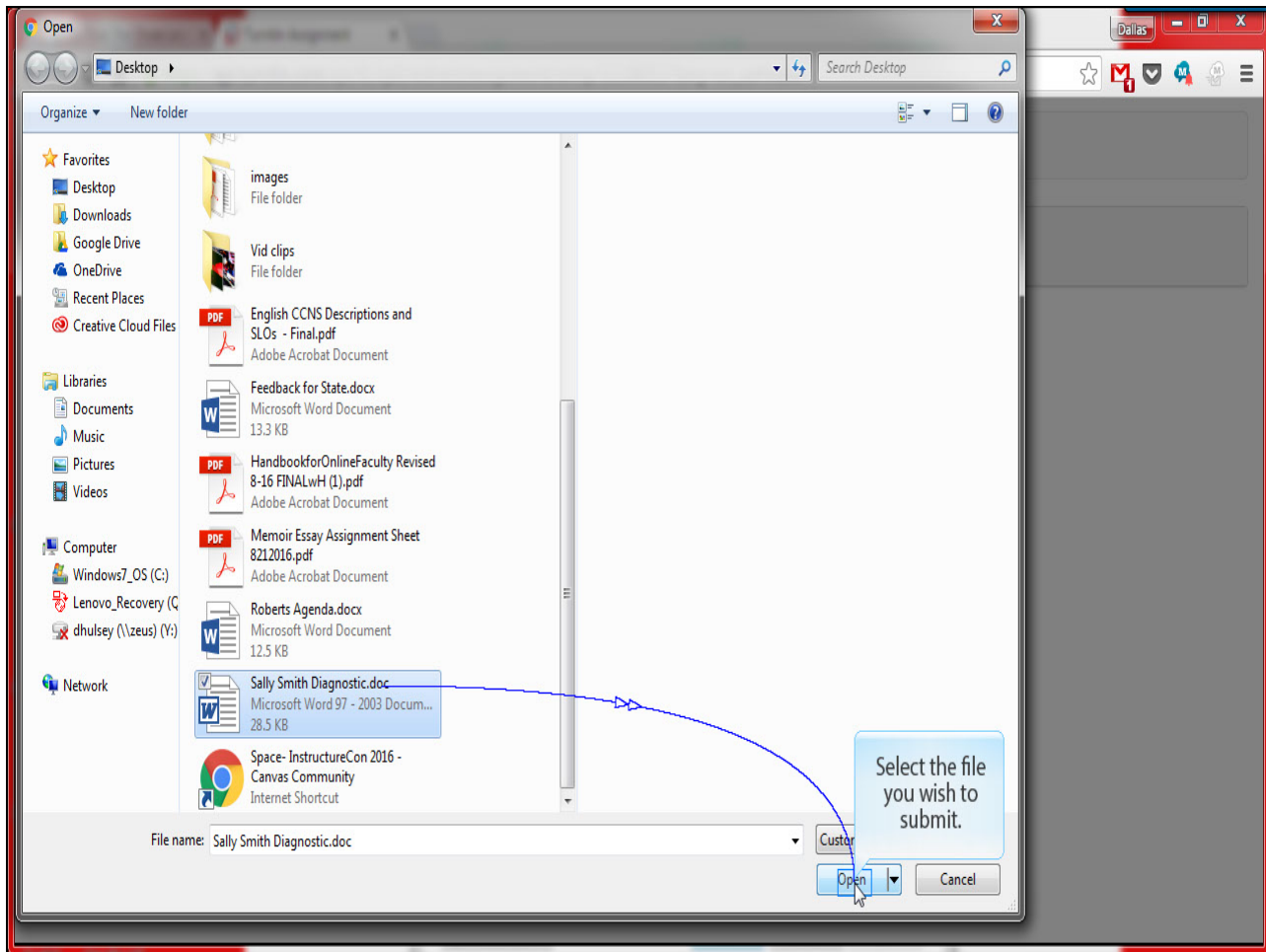
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**4. The “Submit File” popup displays. Note that you can upload a file from your computer or flash drive, paste text, or use DropBox or Google Drive with “Cloud Submission.” Pasting a file may result in loss of formatting, which can impact your grade; pasting is *not* recommended.**



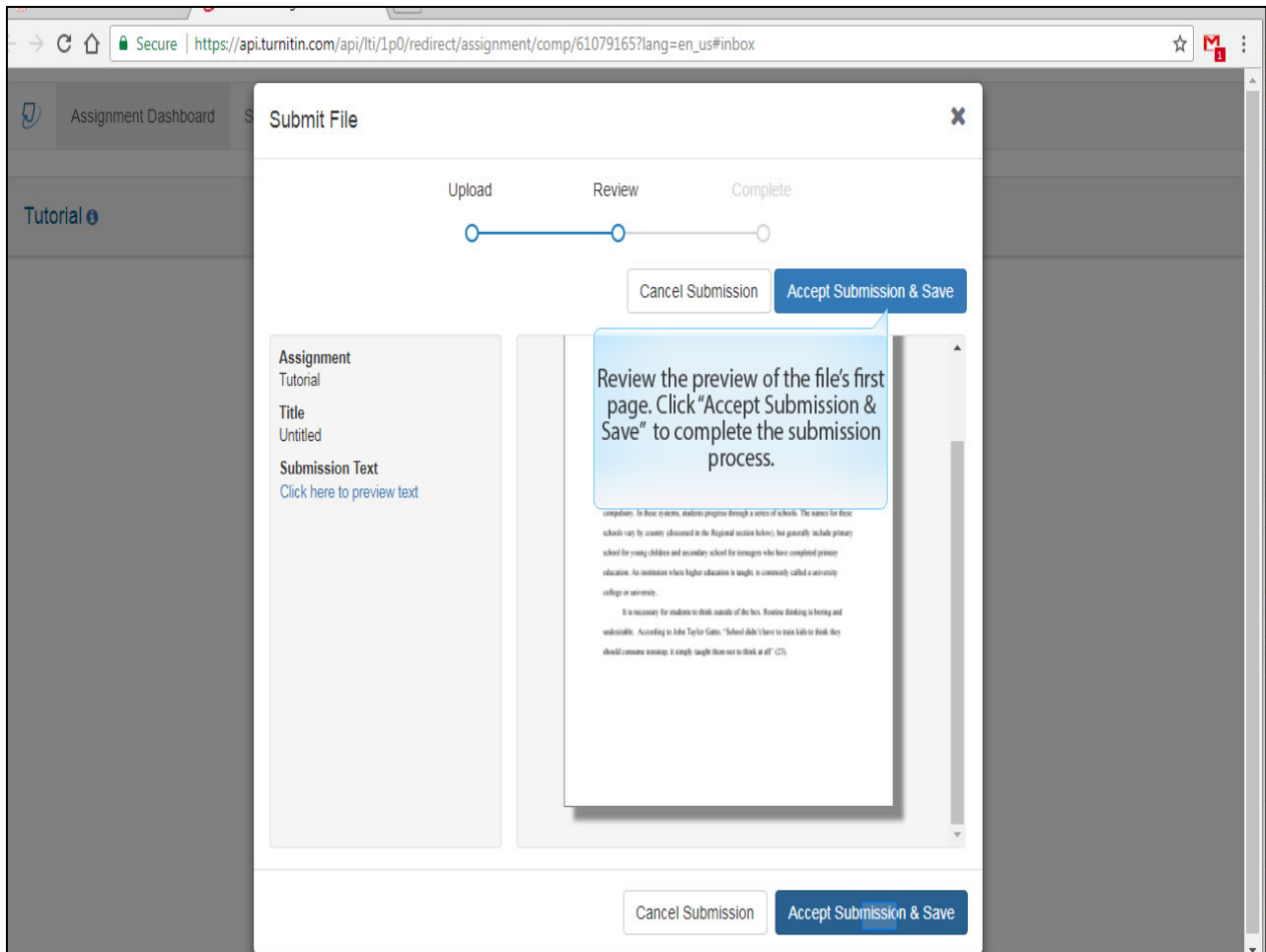
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### 5. Select the file you wish to submit.




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**6. Many professors do not allow students to resubmit for mistakes, so be certain you are submitting the correct file. When you are certain you have the correct file, click “Accept Submission & Save.”**

**8. Wait until the paper loads and appears in Turnitin before closing the tab and returning to Canvas. Be sure you see the green bar that says, “Submission uploaded successfully.” After you have submitted your file, it is a good idea to download a receipt to show your paper has been submitted.**
